

We have some exciting wines to offer you this autumn.

#### 1974 ANGELICA

To start with we are releasing a 1974 Angelica dessert wine, undoubtedly the best Angelica Heitz Cellars has ever offered. It is a luscious sweet dessert wine made from the red mission grape variety. The wine was then aged and mellowed seventeen years in oak before we bottled it this spring in an attractive elongated 750ml bottle, with a specially designed label. Please see the enclosed label and description.

If you try only one wine from Heitz Cellars this fall, be sure it is the 1974 Angelica, a truly exceptional dessert wine. On a recent visit from a Southern couple they likened it to a liqueur reminiscent of Grandmother's homemade freshly baked pecan pie. A nice analogy we thought.

## 1989 NAPA VALLEY CHARDONNAY

Of course we have more wines to entice you with. The other fall release being our 1989 Napa Valley Chardonnay. This is a dry, crisp Chardonnay aged in limousin oak barrels. Austere in style with pleasant and distinct varietal fruit in the aroma, the wine shows excellent overall balance and drinkability. A true value on today's market.

For those of you who prefer a richer style of Chardonnay may we recommend our 1988 "Heitz Vineyard" Chardonnay. A tad more expensive but creamier and more graceful in style.

# RYAN'S RED

Curiosity about the new Meritage wines on the market prompted a blind tasting at our cellar with our staff. We also put our red table wine, the  $\underline{\mathsf{Ryan's}}$  Red in for comparison.

The Meritage wines ranged in price form \$20.00 a bottle up to \$47.00 a bottle. We were pleasantly surprised when the Ryan's Red tied for second at only \$6.75 a bottle!

Obviously, the Ryan's Red was a different style, being lighter and having a fruitier bouquet, but it was better tasting and easier and more pleasant to drink at this time. The Meritage wines were darker, more robust, and needed a lot more time for mellowing.

As we have always said the Ryan's Red is an intriguing blend of selected varietals from our cellars and a reflection Heitz Wine Cellars standard of quality. Definitely an excellent value for your dollar.

We are also releasing a selection of magnums at this time. The above wines represent the largest selection of superb vintages of Cabernet Sauvignons that are available, albeit in limited quantities, from any winery in the United States. However, one cannot live on Cabernets alone, so we suggest and recommend that you also enjoy some of our more modestly priced wines, such as the 1988 Pinot Noir, 1989 Napa Valley Chardonnay, and yes, the 1987 Zinfandel and 1987 Grignolino.

In dessert wines we have a luscious 1974 Angelica which is a family personal favorite. It is made from the Mission grape variety used to make the highly respected original Angelica. Made in the tradition of its California heritage, we believe this is undoubtedly the best Angelica Heitz has ever offered. It is packaged in a distinctive, slender 750ml bottle with a specially designed label in honor of this charming eighteen year old wine.

As most of you already know, we do market our finest Cabernets over a five year span, so we only allocate so many cases each year. This February's consumer quota will apply until March 1, when the distributors, stores, and restaurants will receive their quotas. After March 1st, if there is any inventory left in our "consumer" allocation it will be available on a firstcome, first-served basis. The enclosed order form indicates the specific quotas on the

The best part of the above is that you may order good interesting mixed cases. The 10 percent discount applies to any twelve (12) bottles, or any six (6) magnums.
